Quito - Climate

Quito has a subtropical highland climate. The city has a fairly constant cool climate due to its elevation and proximity to the equator. The average temperature during the day is 66° F (19°C), which generally falls to an average of slightly below 50° F (10°C) at night. The average temperature annually is 64° F (18°C). There are only two obvious seasons in the city: dry and wet. The dry season (summer) runs from June to September, and the wet season (winter) is from October to May.

Quito - The City

Tucked between the green, misty peaks of the Andes and blessed with a warm, welcoming character, the lively city of Quito brings rich history together with modern energy. Those who visit will find everything from overflowing market stands and shamanistic healers to a nightlife that features, among other things, upscale clubs, charming lounges and salsa dancing.

History buffs will enjoy the Old Town, where the architectural influence of Spanish colonisation shows in the red-tiled roofs lining steep, cobblestoned streets. The area is a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site and visitors will relish seeing its ornate buildings and vibrant plazas. Bustling New Town has a more eclectic, business-oriented atmosphere, with its clubs, cafe-lined streets, hotels, offices and shopping centres. The diverse food scene features everything from local Ecuadorian dishes to international fare, and the area has a variety of art galleries and live music venues.

Quito is the cultural centre of the country and Indigenas make up a large proportion of the population. Evidence of their culture is all over the city, from the handicrafts displayed on street corners and ramshackle shops selling traditional everyday goods to the women in thick woollen clothing and felt hats queuing for bus tickets. The Quechuan language rings through streets and central plazas throughout the city.

The destination is rich in historical churches, monasteries and convents, many of which house religious paintings and sculptures dating back to the 16th century. There are also a few museums worth visiting in Quito. Among them, the Museo del Banco Central (beautiful pre-Colombian artefacts), the ethno-historical Museo Mindalae, and the contemporary art museum Museo Guayasamin stand out.

Please take a moment to appreciate these majestic creatures as you wander around the farm, observing their behavior and learning about their importance in the Galapagos ecosystem.

You will enjoy a delicious lunch before taking part in a reforestation project in a nearby area where you'll be planting a tree of native species to help protect the beauty of those highlands.

In the afternoon, head to the Charles Darwin Research Station, a world-renowned institution dedicated to the conservation of the Galapagos Islands.

Witness firsthand the work of international scientists who come to the Galapagos to carry out critical environmental projects. Learn about the unique ecosystem and the ongoing conservation efforts being made to protect it.

Your final stop for the day is the Fausto Llerena Breeding Center, where giant Galapagos tortoises are bred and cared for in a safe and controlled environment.

This is the best place on the islands to see different tortoise species and learn about each one. Observe the tortoises up close and marvel at their size and unique features.

As your day comes to an end, you will have experienced the wonders of Santa Cruz Island and gained a deeper understanding of the importance of conservation efforts in this unique ecosystem.


